Recommended Equipment: Good attitude,

Participants are responsible for their own
transportation and lodging.

Participants in this two day Train-the-Trainer course
will receive a manual and PowerPoint presentation
suitable for use in their own presentations.

First Responder agencies are frequently requested by
schools, businesses, and community members for
direction and presentations on what to do if confronted with
an active attacker event. The Civilian Response and
Casualty Care (CRCC) course, designed and built on the
Avoid, Deny, Defend / Run, Hide, Fight strategy developed
by ALERRT in 2004, provides strategies, guidance and a
proven plan for surviving an active shooter event.

This course combines the civilian response with the Stop
the Bleed Campaign, which empowers civilians to provide
life-saving medical aid before first responders ever arrive.
Topics include the history and prevalence of active shooter
events, civilian response options, medical issues, and
considerations for conducting drills.
